Andrew Chambers- January 9th Richland Two Teacher of the Year

Chambers is the Convergence Media magnet director. In the three years since he joined the Richland Two family, Chambers has guided and mentored his broadcast students, going from winning few awards to winning the most in the Southeast. Last year RNE-TV Live won the Pacemaker award, the most prestigious scholastic journalism award in the nation. He has built nationally recognized programs at two high schools, is recognized as one of the top scholastic broadcast advisors in the country and recently earned the title of adviser of the year by the S.C. He has a bachelor s degree from Charleston Southern and a master s in Integrating Technology in the classroom from Walden University.

Mr. Hodge is a frequent speaker on topics in astronomy and planetary science, and he is a partner in the Bethune Observers Group that operates a series of private observatories in Kershaw County and he is also an active amateur astronomer. Mr. Hodge formerly taught a graduate class in environmental law and regulations at USC for about 20 years.
