## **Council on Legislation 2022**

Every three years Rotary International holds a Council on Legislation to consider changes to the organization's governing documents. Each district in the world has a representative and proposals are submitted by Rotarians, clubs, districts, and the RI Board of Directors. You can always count on spirited debate and lots of ideas.

This year the council considered 94 proposals. Here are some of the proposals that were approved:

- 22-13 A member does not have to work or reside in a club's territory
- 22-15 Satellite members can come from any club, not just the home club
- 22-18 Rotaractors can serve on RI committees
- 22-46 Increases dues each of the next 3 years
- 22-70 Update the wording of the Constitution without substantive changes
- 22-78 Changes the wording of the Community & International Service Avenue of Service to include the phrase "positive peace"
- 22-92 Removes club board approval of Rule of 85. It is now automatic

(This is not a complete list!)

We will be updating curriculum to include the changes. Please make sure your discussion leaders are away of the changes and address them in any sessions before July 1 this year.




