RLI Has a Podcast!



RLI helps Rotaractors connect and interact with other change-makers, gain skills for collaborating with community leaders, and find new, effective ways to build up communities.



Going all out is right

The 74th student training session of the Rotary Leadership Academy was successfully completed in beautiful Taitung.

The sunny and beautiful Taitung warmly welcomed the partners of the 74th student training meeting of the Rotary Leadership Academy. In order to let Rotary members across the country appreciate the beauty of Houshan, the Rotary Leadership Academy came to Houshan Taitung for the first time to give classes, and finally The dream of Principal Stan of the Rotary Leadership Academy was fulfilled, and it attracted Rotary elites from all over the country to sign up. Co-organized by the Taitung Puyuma Rotary Club in District 3510, the two-day course on February 18,19, 2012 ended successfully with the full harvest of all the students.

The Rotary Leadership Institute team arranged many excellent teachers for the 74th Rotary Elite to teach the students. Each lecturer has its own field of expertise, such as 1. The background and history of the Rotary Leadership Institute 2. Social responsibility (ethics) and career services) 3. How to market Rotary (attracting members, public image and brand identity) 4. Leadership (leadership, coordination and communication, team building, engaging members) 5. Strategic planning (drawing up service projects, building stronger Rotary Club) 6. Financial Planning (Rotary Fund) 7. Production Evaluation (Making Impact). The whole course is divided into two classes, AB. The lecturers adopt an interactive teaching method to discuss with the students. They brainstorm with each other on different topics, and experience sharing creates different sparks. The students share experiences from different Rotary clubs in different regions. and valuable opinions, so that students can better understand the true meaning of Rotary, so that each student can really absorb the content taught in the classroom, and then master the operational skills of Rotary organizations, and be more handy in promoting Rotary service work in the future .



Ghana Division (District 9102)

Brief Report for the 2022-2023 Rotary Year

The Rotary Leadership Institute (RLI) Ghana Division (District 9102) held Part 1 and a Part 3 courses on 11th March 2023 at the National Banking College, Accra, Ghana. There were 45 participants for Part 1 (in 2 classes) and 20 for Part 3. Faculty members included PDG Sam Worentetu (Chairman), PDG Jeffrey Aful (Registrar), PDG Yvonne Kumoji-Darko (Treasurer) and DGN Florence Hagan (Secretary). As has always been the case, feedback from participants was highly positive.

Since the inception of RLI Ghana Division (D9102) by RLI Nigeria in October 2017, we have had the following total participation in various courses:

- Part 1: 305 Participants
- Part 2: 114 Participants
- Part 3: 116 Participants

RLI Ghana Division is looking forward to exciting times ahead as Ghana becomes a One-Country District effective 1st July 2023.

Lone Star Continued:

"It has been a great honor to have graduated and participated in three Rotary Leadership Institute trainings! I was also informed that I am the first Rotaractor to graduate from Rotary Leadership Institute from District 5930! I feel so honored & blessed!" said Picazo.

You make a living by what you do, but you make a life by what you give, and RLI empowers Rotaractors to unleash their leadership skills to make a positive impact both locally and globally. The leadership skills they have gained will help their career skills making them stronger and better leaders.

Cross-generational connections gives them the opportunities to share their skills with Rotarians and provides reverse mentorship opportunities. This helps Rotarians discover new and innovative leadership skills which nurtures personal growth for both groups of leaders.

RLI has a ripple effect. Rotaractors tell their friends about the leadership skills available in Rotary which opens the door and encourages their friends and colleagues to start their journey in Rotary.

Opening the door and encouraging Rotaractors to learn more about the world of Rotary through RLI gives them a place to share ideas and help solve important social issues.

"Thank you to everyone who has invested and empowered me throughout my journey!" said Picazo. We need to show them Rotary is a place to learn how to solve important social issues, and RLI is where we help them discover, grow and share their leadership skills.

Taiwan Continued:

Chair Stan of the Taiwan branch of the Rotary Leadership Institute encouraged the trainees to say: Rotary people take "four major tests; five core values; seven focus areas" as their pursuit goals, and take Rotary's "superego service and good deeds" as their core The motto of life, use these ideas and values, come in (Rotary) to learn, appreciate the true meaning, and go out (social) to serve. Annie from the Kaohsiung Qi-he Rotary Club said: The two-day study has taught him "rigorous study, relaxed friendship, and attentive service". Students benefited a lot from the Attention mental attitude of West Point Military Academy. Every Rotary teacher (PDG) imparts the Rotary "Secrets" selflessly, so that the trainees can gain 300-year-old skills, and they are full of motivation to "go all out" after the training!

Although everyone came from different regions and different Rotary clubs, the participants were very involved in the class, and successfully passed the teacher's test of each class and obtained a certificate of completion. I believe that these Rotary elites with professional Rotary knowledge and service enthusiasm will uphold the Rotary spirit and attitude given by the Rotary Leadership Institute in the future to promote Rotary's service work and become good partners in the community! And move towards the goal of imagining Rotary.

In the end, the principal issued the training certificates to all the students one by one in the singing of "Brilliant Moment", and ended the 2-day wonderful class.
