Grubb began the business in Spokane in 1979 and expanded to Coeur d'Alene in 1986. In the first few years the company was open, for two to three months at a time, Peter would present to civic and community groups all the way from Bellingham to San Diego trying to drum up business! The mission of ROW Adventures is to Share Nature and Enrich Lives. In 47 years of guiding, the company has trips available in 25 countries on 6 continents.
