PROGRAM

JIM COLEMAN introduced Glenn Miles with Kootenai Metropolitan Planning Organization (KMPO). Miles has been Executive Director of KMPO since March 2023, and serves on the Coeur d'Alene Regional CHamber'S Public Policy committee. He is native to the Inland Northwest as his family homesteaded land in the region.

KMPO was established in 1979 by local, city, and county jurisdictions to deal with master planning and moving traffic in and through the geographic areas. According to the federal government, since the 1962 Federal-aid Highway Act, federal authorizing legislation for expenditure of surface transportation funds has required metropolitan area transportation plans and programs to be developed through a continuing, cooperative, and comprehensive (3-C) planning process.KMPO is the organization in charge of that and has been addressing traffic issues for over 20 years. Essentially, Kootenai County as a metropolitan area is operating on a legacy transportation system that is too old for the current transportation needs of the region.

Within the Kootenai County metropolitan area, transportation plays a large role in the development of the area. Next to real time data is collected in 93 intersections across the county. Highway 95 at peak times is the worst in the area and Seltice and Kathleen are the worst for east/west travel. I-90 will always be a challenge.

KMPO is currently underway on a 2024-2030 Transportation Improvement Program that will cover six years of state, local, federally funded projects. KMPO is to be very competitive with federal grant applications or our region cannot afford the projects alone.
