PROGRAM

SANDY PATANO introduced Phil McGrane, a 4th generation Idahoan and the Idaho Secretary of State. McGrane is a self-proclaimed data geek, calling himself an elections junkie and elections nerd. His desire is to make elections fun again!

McGrane wants to ensure citizens and voters that Idaho has a VERY good elections system. One of his main goals is to get more information out to voters and inspire people to vote. To that end, the Secretary of Stateâ \in TMs office completely revamped the voting website www.VoteIdaho.gov and there is fantastic new information to help voters register, request absentee ballots, get information on candidates, find election results, campaign finance, and more.

Today, the primary election starts in the state for the May 21 primary election, which means absentee ballots are being mailed out to voters. McGrane explained that primary elections are where the majority of local decisions are made. The elections are often won in the primary elections statewide. Interestingly, women outvote men consistently throughout the state. McGrane noted that Idaho is becoming more $\hat{a}\in \text{cered}\hat{a}\in \text{with conservative citizens}\,\hat{a}\in \text{cevoting with their feet}\hat{a}\in \text{which means they are political refugees who are frustrated and physically moving states. This trend is happening across the country, and the result in Idaho is 71% of people moving to the state are registering as Republican. What is interesting is the large number of unaffiliated voters across the country, oftentimes outweighing Democrats.$

With all the political strife and turmoil in the country, and within our own state, McGrane remains optimistic. He reminded us that America is an experiment. We've taken arms against each other, had presidents assassinated, been through worse as a country, and we have remained. He believes in the US Constitution and what the founding fathers stood for, and is honored and privileged to serve in his role as Secretary of State.
