

March 5th Meeting: Franklin Blvd Update!!

The City is working on plans to transform Franklin Boulevard into a street that serves all travelers including people who walk, bike, ride the bus and drive. The project will help meet Eugene's climate recovery goals and encourage ways for businesses and neighborhoods near Franklin Boulevard to redevelop the boulevard into a more comfortable connector of places, rather than a divider. HDR is lead consultant, and Cogito supporting the public involvement. The City of Eugene is collaborating closely with the local partners including the University of Oregon, Lane Transit District, the City of Springfield, and the Oregon Department of Transportation.

What's that you're doing, Stacey Ray?

Connection with nature is a through-line and constant grounding force in my life. Growing up in central Montana, I rode shotgun in a combine listening to Paul Harvey (thanks for that recent reminder, Bob) and taking in the "big sky country" that always threatened to swallow me up. I followed my parents from the farm to their butcher shop, getting candy from hunters who brought elk and deer in the fall, and helping finish log homes with my Dad in spring. When I visited my grandparents in the Rocky Mountains, we picked wildflowers and huckleberries and paddled creeks with broomsticks. My grandfather took us two girls to trickling streams where we panned for gold. It was only after he died that I found out he seeded our gold pans with beautiful big flakes he found himself years earlier.

I lived within wheat embellished plains, drove with my Dad to the precarious edges of fingers that spread out over the Missouri River breaks, camped in evergreen mountains, and learned to fish for trout and catfish near our community of 250 people. In high school, I brought my homework and set up a card table near the water's edge waiting for the catfish bell to jingle.

I knew that art and academics would get me out of that place that was both so small and so expansive, much like my mind at the time. Sending myself off to Montana State University in Bozeman made senseâ€"the mountains were calling (as they say). I began hiking in the five surrounding mountain ranges, picked up cross-country skiing, and spent countless hours standing in the Madison, Gallatin, and Yellowstone Rivers trying to teach myself fly-fishing. I didn't catch anything but passing greenery for a year, but it wasn't the prospect of fish that kept me

there.

Oregon has only grown my passion for the outdoors. I crave curiosity, adventure, and experiences that engage my senses through quiet observance and noticing the tiny moments that tickle fingertips, buzz the insides of ears, soften noses, and send sharp piney air into lungs. I've fallen in love with birds, and my binoculars are now a constant accessory on urban walks and outdoor adventures. After a divorce and losing my dad far too early, I found respite in a canoe: my companion in silently stalking the sounds and glimpses that tend to go unnoticed in our overly busy world. I've also learned to row a small pontoon, and between these two vessels, I've had some of the most joyful moments of my life floating on glassy lakes, traversing marshy mazes, and holding my breath through rapids on the McKenzie, Rogue, and Deschutes rivers. A few summers ago, I paddled 107 miles of the Missouri River in Montana, experiencing much of the notable journey of Lewis and Clark, and more intimately, some of the wildest part of my childhood backyard.

In just the 35 years of my life so far, I've already had experiences that took me through intense grief, loss, love, and transformation. I've felt the brevity and frailty of life, as most of us have. I'm gratefully reminded of both frailty and resilience when I'm in nature, which has been the greatest gift of all.
