Presidents' Message



International Women's Day was Friday, March 8 and March is Womenâ€[™]s History Month in the United States. The first International Women's Day (IWD) was held in 1911 and the date of March 8th for international Women's Day was set in 1913. The United Nations General Assembly adopted a resolution proclaiming a United Nations Day for Womenâ€[™]s Rights and International Peace in 1977. In 2011, on the 100th centenary of IWD, March 2011 was

declared as Women's History Month by then-President Obama.

Women's struggle for fairness, equality and inclusion has a much longer history than 123 years. That history is populated with struggles large and small, victories and setbacks both peaceful and bloody, and people courageous and cowardly. Thinking about this history, one of my favorite quotes comes to mind: "The arc of the moral universe is long, but it bends towards justice." This statement by MLK is a paraphrase of a quote by Unitarian minister Theodore Parker (1853). As an agnostic, I hear this quote as $\hat{a} \in \mathbb{C}$ The struggle for a fair and equitable existence is long, but it can be bent towards justiceâ€.

I think that Rotary is (since 1987) on the right side of this struggle and as members, I trust that we can agree that a fair and equitable existence for everyone is tethered unbreakably to our own tenet of "Is it fair to all concerned?â€.

The women in our Club, in our lives, and in the world, alive and long dead, have lived with this struggle all their lives. They have had personal victories large and small, experienced heartbreaking setbacks, observed courage and acted courageously, railed against cowardice and fought it within themselves when they felt too exhausted and out numbered to believe they could go on. They all are bending the arc.

I salute them all. I'II do better acknowledging them and I'II help steepen the curve.


