March 19th Meeting: 4J Tax Levy Renewal

Judy Newman is a member of the Eugene 4J School Board. She was the founder and co-director of Early Childhood CARES. She is the Senior Advisor for Early Childhood CARES and Strategic Advisor to Lane County's Early Childhood Hub at UWLC. She is on the faculty of the Oregon Research to School Network (ORSN) at University of Oregon

4J School Board has referred a measure renewing our local option tax levy to the May 2024 primary ballot.

This would not be a new tax or a tax increase, but a continuation of the five-year levy that has provided additional money to help pay for 4J's day-to-day operations since 2000. The levy generates about \$25 million in operating revenue for the current school year, equivalent to about 32 school days or 205 teaching positions. It is set to expire in June 2025.

The proposed levy would generate an estimated \$26.4 million to \$29.8 million per year for five years to support district operations. If the levy is not renewed, our district would need to make budget cuts of identical amounts over the same time span, reducing annual spending by about 10.5 percent.

The tax would continued to be levied at a rate of \$1.50 per \$1,000 of assessed value of a property. The rate is subject to a voter-approved property tax limitation, so some property owners pay less than the maximum rate.
