March 26th Meeting: Child and adolescent behavioral health



With Randy Kamphaus Senior Advisor, External Affairs Professor, School Psychology

Professor Kamphaus' focus has been psychological and educational test development; child and adolescent behavioral health screening, and assessment; and diagnostic practice. His best-known test development effort is the Behavior Assessment System for Children, the most widely used children's behavioral health assessment system in the United States, and increasingly, internationally.

This research has been funded by grants from the U.S. Department of Education and its Institute of Education.
