May 14th Meeting: The Springfield Report



With Nancy Newton, Springfield City Manager

Nancy is an experienced local government executive who is skilled in financial management, administration, policy analysis, organizational development, and equity and inclusion. She is a positive, results-oriented leader with an Executive Master of Public Administration from Portland State University. She also holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in Management and Organizational Leadership from George Fox University and is a Credentialed Manager through the International City/County Management Association (ICMA). Her passion is public service and finding creative ways to address organizational needs. Nancy adheres to the servant leader philosophy, which focuses on the growth and well-being of people and the communities to which they belong. Nancy worked in the non-profit sector before working for the Clackamas County Commission on Children and Families, where she worked to help keep youth out of the juvenile justice system. While at Clackamas County Nancy worked on several special projects: she helped develop and was a trainer for the County's "Building Connections" diversity, equity, and inclusion program; she drafted legislation requiring evidence-based practices in youth programs; and she was a facilitator for the nationally recognized "Complete

Communities" community engagement program. Nancy worked for Clackamas County for 17 years in progressively responsible positions serving as Assistant to the County Administrator, Deputy County Administrator, and Interim County Administrator before transitioning to Sacramento County, California where she was appointed Assistant County Executive/Chief Operating Officer. While in Sacramento, Nancy led the 2020 census outreach countywide using a network of local nonprofits, which was later proposed as a model in California for statewide census outreach.

Nancy has an extensive volunteer history with various agencies such as United Way, Dress for Success, and the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development Point-in-Time Housing and Inventory Count. She has served on several boards of directors including the Springfield Community Development Corporation, Springfield Area Chamber of Commerce, United Way California Capitol Region, Technology for Teaching, and the Alumni Board of Directors for George Fox University. Nancy has also been a presenter, advisor, and mentor to MPA students at Portland State University Hatfield School of Government.

Nancy lives in Springfield, Oregon with her husband Steve and their very spoiled Australian LabradoodleScout. She enjoys reading, cycling, creating music and artwork and attending cultural events.

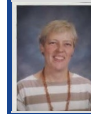
Solar flares are often accompanied by coronal mass ejections, or CMEs, which are explosions of plasma and magnetic material from the sun. Bill Murtagh, program coordinator for the SWPC and seasoned space weather forecaster, previously told Nexstar that CMEs are "essentially the Sun shooting a magnet out into space."

The latest coronal mass ejections, or CMEs, were so strong, it prompted the SWPC to issue a [G4 geomagnetic storm watch](#) on Thursday ahead of their anticipated arrival. This warning level is "every rare," the SWPC noted, but it sparked quite the

celestial show.

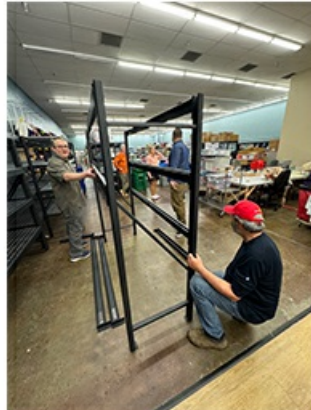
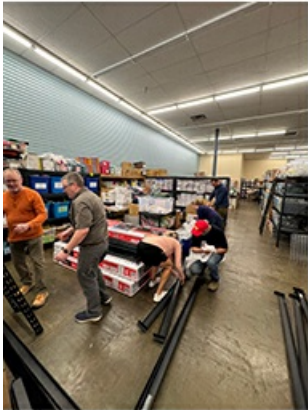

During the past year, Bags of Love provided necessities and comfort items, often personalized to the needs, hopes and desires of the individual recipient, to 4,800 children and young adults in Lane County. The recipients included juvenile victims and/or witnesses to domestic violence and sexual assault, sex trafficking victims, labor trafficking victims, recent placements in foster homes, and homeless youth.

Thanks to the Eugene Rotary Charitable Fund's generous grant of \$3,000 and our volunteers, our Club helped expand Bags of Love's operational capacity for their crucial and compassionate services to our young people in crisis by purchasing and assembling 13 large gorilla racks! 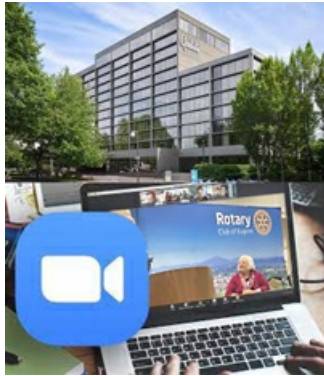
