May 11th Social Event: Constellations

The Very Little Theater is presenting 'Constellations' directed by Richard Sheeland, Karen's husband!



Our lives are, in part, a matter of chance, we can't control the circumstances we are born into. But how our lives play out depends largely on the decisions, big and small, that we make along the way. All of us at various times in our lives think "What ifâ€. What if I had stayed in the Army and gone to Officer Candidate School when the opportunity was given to me? What if I had accepted the invitation to the party that cute girl

invited me to my junior year in college? What would my live be like if you had continued to study biology? What if there was another you, many other versions of you in a vast array of alternate universes who made the other decision? This is the premise of Nick Payne's brilliant, award winning play " *Constellationsâ€*. First produced in London in 2012, the play has become an international hit being performed around the world. It opened on Broadway in 2015 staring Jake Gyllenhaal and Ruth Wilson, who was nominated for a Tony Award for her performance. It is currently enjoying a sold out run Off Broadway.

I not sure I have ever been moved by a play as I was when I first read this beautiful piece of theatre. I knew I had to bring it to VLT. I had a small but talented group of actors show up for auditions. One challenge, which turned out to be a bonus, was how to ask people to be understudies in a two person play, so I decided to form two casts who will perform on alternate nights. The two couples have been encouraged to develop their own version of the play, which is perfectly in keeping with the "alternate universe†basis of the work. It has been a joy seeing these two couples find their characters and develop their relationships. I like to think of it as a piece of music, perhaps piano jazz, with a theme and variations.

Despite the challenging structure of the play and the complexity of some of the subject matter; theoretical early universe cosmology, quantum mechanics, string theory, it is at its heart a love story and $I\hat{a} \in \mathbb{T}$ ve always been a sucker for a good love story.
