


BOOK RECCOMENDATION




ANNOUNCEMENTS

TODAY'S PROGRAM—CRAFT TALKS WITH DON CLIVER, AND TIM MANN Don Cliver:

Don spent his childhood and early adult years in Marin County. He worked for his father's paint company from the age of 12 through high school. Then, he landed his first job in the banking industry, where he has spent most of his working years. That first job was a heady one: empty ash trays and the like at Crocker Bank, which later became Wells Fargo when they merged. Don worked his way up the ladder until he decided to take a turn: he started working in the golf



course irrigation field, then became GM of a golf course management company. Somewhere sandwiched in there **Don** got into the restaurant business, working for the famous Hilltop Café in Novato. Later, in that restaurant field, Don and his wife started a franchise sandwich shop in Santa Rosa. That didn't work out because of family health issues.

So, **Don** returned to his adult working roots, and went to work for Sterling Bank in Oakland. Spent 16 years there, stayed through several bank mergers, and became active in community affairs, such as Rotary. Today, **Don** is VP Branch Manager at the Healdsburg Summit Bank, where he reports his life is grand. **Don** and his wife, Tracy, live in Oakmont in Santa Rosa.

Tim Mann:

Tim and his wife, Cristi, live in Windsor. They have four children, three boys and a girl. Well, the photos we saw cause me to change that to three young men, and a young lady. We learned the background and the current status of all four siblings. Fun to hear. Tim spent his early years in Indiana. His father was a US Marine, so they moved around a bit.
