

### TODAY'S PROGRAM





**Cathy King** and Dan Balfe presented an update to the HANWASH project

Rotary District 5130 is driving the Hanwash project in Leogane, Haiti. The aim of this project is to provide sustainable water and sanitation for 199,000 people in Leogane.

The commune of Leogane has a rich and unique culture, offering much in the way of arts, music, literature, cuisine, and architecture. Despite the diverse community assets and charms, economic opportunity and human development remains a dream for many.

The main town of Leogane was the epicenter of the infamous Jan 12, 2010, earthquake and was catastrophically affected with 80-90% of buildings being

damaged or destroyed and thousands killed. Access to safe drinking water and sanitation remains problematic for tens of thousands of people.

Today, just 1200 households receive service inside a coverage area of 5,000; water is apportioned to 200 homes at a time and only available for a few hours a week. With a US\$200,000 Global Grant, new investments would be made in a solar-powered generator, batteries, a water storage tank and management training.
