SCHOLARSHIP FUND UPDATES

His Trust ensured that \$33,000 was issued to our Scholarship Fund within months of his death. This year, we were informed that another approximate \$91,000 is to be provided to our fund (already done, according to **President Kellie**). **Rob Jacobi** was a true advocate for our club and for the youth we support with scholarships.



Regarding scholarships, several members of our club have been working together as a group to find ways we can better serve HHS and Geyserville High School students with scholarships. Andy Elkind provided an update today, indicating that our club will issue larger scholarships to fewer students. This is viewed as a positive step
