TODAY'S PROGRAM



David Hagele, Mayor of Healdsburg. He is with Summit Bank. Has been on City Council twice. This is his second time as mayor (a rotating position on the Council). Update on what Healdsburg City Council is working on: Housing, Water Security, Streets and Transportion and Infrastructure Investment.

Main issues:

-Housing.

- Workforce housing (several moderate-income housing projects started or in the works)
- Housing the unsheltered (L&M campus secured and already working; further development planned. Funding stream uses tourist taxes.

Water Security.

- -#1 priority is conservation; Healdsburg is proportionally a bigger water user than other towns.
- -#2 Recycled water expansion of irrigation to all public parks and fields.
- -#3 Underground storage of rainwater

Streets/Transport.

 New bridge for SMART train. Use of old train station as SMART depot. Modernizing -Healdsburg Ave. north of Powell to north end of town (+ bike lanes that can be switched to car lanes if evacuation needed).

Infrastructure.

- -Fire substation across from Enzo Village
- Foley Family Pavilion has commenced construction
- -Fitch Mtn. access improvements (Opening Ceremony May 4th)
- Park design (Env. Review of Badger Park to the river; Saggio Hills park design ongong)
- -Master calendar of events
- -Climate mobilization strategy (community input)
- -DEI work plan (community input)
