TODAY'S PROGRAM



Don Mitchell introduced today's speaker, Healdsburg's Chief of Police, Matt Jenkins. Chief Jenkins joined the Healdsburg Department as an intern in 2002, became a full-time officer in 2003 and after time as a sergeant became chief in 2021. Chief Jenkins gave statistics for such things as incidents, calls and responses as well as details on the staffing: 27 full time, 3 part time of which 18 are police officers - an increase of 1 over 1990! Larceny rates dropped by 30% recently - perhaps because of the new Healdsburg entry

point cameras that identify stolen vehicles. Weapons crime is increasing. He answered questions about 911 calls, impaired driving, assault statistics and surveillance cameras.
