## **PROGRAM**

Dawn Manley of the Food Bank of Contra Costa County and Solano County spoke to us about the Food Bank. The Food Bank was started with a mission to end hunger and to provide service to neighbors in need. It started just collecting food and distributing to the needy. It has grown to serve 465,000 people each month.

Food Bank works first in partnership with 260 other agencies: shelters, churches, government, etc. It also does food rescue with grocery stores, restaurants, etc. They had grocery recovery of 12 million pounds last year.

Second is their Distribution: They have trucks going to 362 different locations for fresh, healthy food. They provide 3.4 million meals each month. The third part of their program is advocacy and awareness. They let the public know of the need, and appeal for volunteers and donations. They also have a 6 week course helping people who have benefited from these services to learn to tell their stories to the public and elected officials.

Who is at risk for food insecurity? Your neighbors. It can happen to anyone. The Food Bank gave 40 million pounds of food last year, fresh, healthy food. Where do they get their food? 53% is purchased, in bulk, to provide for the set menus of healthy meals. 25% comes from food drives; and 25% from USDA programs.

Food Bank has two large warehouses where food is stored and sorted. The Concord warehouse is 35,000 sq. ft. The Fairfield warehouse is 100,000 sq. ft. It is the West Coast Hub Disaster Relief Center. They store disaster preparedness food. They shipped to Maui after the fire.

The Food Bank funding is 65% individual contributions. They can get 2 meals out of every \$ donated. But food drives are needed too, to get variety in the diet. They stress donations, volunteers, and advocacy.
