PROGRAM

The speaker was Tom C; Deputy Athletics Director & Associate Vice-President Advancement and Athletics, St. Mary's College, Moraga. Tom gave a thorough review of the state of NCAA collegiate athletics nationwide, and the prominent place of a small college of 2200 located in our neighborhood.

The landscape of college athletics, i.e., football, basketball, has seen prominent schools such as, CAL, USC, Stanford, and UCLA, moved from West to East. Regardless, St. Mary's, the smallest school in the NCAA Basketball tournament, was the top of 2 California schools in the tournament.

He also discussed the complicated creation in 2018 of the "Transfer Portal," enabling athletes to transfer amongst schools and compete. He also discussed the Name, Image, and Likeness (NIL) "Fair Pay to Play" act enabling athletes to receive compensation for their services to their schools.

Tom emphasized the importance at St. Mary's of the "student athlete." At St. Mary's, there are 340 student athletes for seventeen team sports. 150 of the 340 have GPA's of 3.25. There is a ninety-five percent graduation rate. The valedictorian for 2023 was a member of the women's soccer team.

During the past sixteen years, St. Mary's is only one of four teams in the nation to have had post season success. For the past fifteen years St. Mary's has had the highest winning percentage, .771% in California amongst twenty-four Divisions.

All proud accomplishments for "the little school that could."
