

This week's program was Kim Curtis of Goodness Village - Tiny Homes for the Unsheltered. Kim first recapped what the village is all about and then spoke about the people who live there and services and programs that are provided. She made several key points: only unsheltered in the Tri-Valley live there, the residents are primarily Caucasian because other races and cultures tend to continue to take care of their family members who are struggling, all staff are trained in the process of recovery, and we need more housing for the unsheltered everywhere. Kim also spoke about how Rotary has supported Goodness Village and showed slides of some of the projects: a deck and a firepit for group meetings, little libraries, screen doors, and chicken coops, to name a few.
