The studio engages tradition's best practices while pushing the craft of woodworking forward. Natural materials are elevated by composing them into simple, modern forms. Finishes are engineered to get better with age and communicate a sublime warmth and presence only possible with small scale production. Often, Jared and his team source rare and



unique California hardwood species like Claro Walnut and Bay Laurel milled from fallen or displaced trees. The studio has produced hundreds of original pieces of furniture for residences and commercial clients like Google, Vans, Github, and Levi's, exhibiting work at numerous venues including the Harvard Graduate School of Design, S.F. Museum of Craft and Design, International Contemporary Furniture Fair, Pasadena Contemporary Art Museum, and has been fea-



He is a former newspaper marketing and advertising executive (21 years with five metropolitan daily newspapers) and 20 years as an executive director in nonprofit management, including Stockton's Emergency Food Bank and the Downtown Stockton Alliance.
