tendees. The club's general fund subsidizes the rest of the bill. At \$650, the loss to the club is not sustaina-

ble. Your board has discussed a proposal raising our lunch rate to \$25 for the

meal. In addition, those who do not order lunch will pay either \$5 or \$10. Also, all club members who do not attend the meeting will be billed \$5 or \$10. At our present membership level, a \$5 charge will not recover the \$650 weekly rate. The concept is that the club must cover the cost associated with the meeting room itself. We are contacting you to get your feedback on this concept or to get alternative ideas.

Before they spoke, Lorie presented the Food Bank's CEO Leonard Hanson and Consuelo Ishihara with a grant of \$1,758.00. Consuelo told us it will be used for video equipment. Two UOP students are making a

documentary about the Food Bank to tell it's story. It'll be in theaters soon! Leonard Hanson from the Emergency Food Bank started his talk about the great connection between our club and the Food Bank. We've had many offsites there, sorting the donated food products. Also Past President Ray Call was interim director, and they wouldn't be where they are now without Ray's work. Past President Evan Stone installed a Wi-Fi system so that they can communicate with the hundreds of people in line to pick up food.



The need for the Food Bank is amplified by the current economic state of our State. People are in more debt because of inflation and high interest rates. Inflation has outpaced wage growth. They are buying groceries with credit cards. The credit card debt has risen to 1.05 billion dollars! In 2017 Bread cost \$1.54, today it's \$2.10. Gas was \$2.17, it's now \$3.29, (not in California!). Rent was \$1,424.00, now it's \$1,713.00.

North Stockton Rotary

The mission Statement of the Food Bank is to build stronger community by providing a safety net of food to residents of San Joaquin County who find themselves in an emergency situation. They serve working families, seniors, veterans, and single parent households. In 2022 the EFB distributed 5 million pounds of non-perishable food. 1.1 million pounds of fresh produce. They have 27 community partry partners and over 299,375 families served. SJ County has 15.9% residents who live below the poverty level. 45% of families withing the county who are economically self sufficient. 25% of the counties children live at or below the poverty level. 12.1% of our families live in households that are considered food insecure.

In 2022, the community helped the Food Bank by donating over 23,000 hours of volunteer work. The Food Bank needs more volunteers for their Run & Walk Against Hunger and Christmas Dinner Giveaways annual events.

The EFB has Nutrition Education through FB Live, ZOOM and pre-recorded cooking classes. These are free to the Food Bank Patrons.

Food as Medicine, a program partnered with the Abbott Fund had 40 patients, reached 500 in 2021 and 1,000 clients in 2022. Door Delivery Program,

started in 2020, is boxed food to seniors and shut-ins during the pandemic. Starting with 35 seniors has grown to 840. Their Holiday Turkey Giveaways produced 3,500 turkey dinners distributed. Non out of a helicopter from WKRP!

The Food Bank has purchased the land next door and will begin to build a new warehouse on it. It will be 15,500 Square feet with a much needed loading dock. See ►
