

Natures beauty on display today



Graham has been a member of the Stockton Rotary for 34 years, he's a past president (11/12), he works with the A.G. Mean girls in middle school taught her valuable life lessons. Puberty was embarrassing, Rotary programs provide sex education for unknowing teens. The Rotary Mission Pink Program answers and teaches the teens. She realized school was a privilege.

As you know, public school restrooms can be very dirty. Some kids won't even use them all day. A Rotary project fixed 3,650 bathrooms with a \$50,000 Grant. They created Hope through cleanliness and sex education, creating a cleaner and smarter world.

Next was Zaina ansar from Lincoln High School. She spoke of creating hope in the World with effort and dedication to help fight disease, make a better educational system and end poverty.
