Now, almost 120 years later, we are in nearly every country in the world - 1.4 million members strong and with 43,000 clubs. Because of our diverse organization, Rotary

International adopted a <u>diversity</u>, <u>equity</u>, <u>and inclusion statemen</u>t that sends an engaging message to embrace inclusivity. Currently, the average age of a Rotarian is 61 years old, with 25% of the total Rotary membership being women. 
