Ada Gates Patton

First Woman Farrier in the United States

In 1978, Ada became the first woman farrier licensed to show thoroughbred racehorses in the United States and Canada. Her unique status gave her great opportunities including guest appearances on: Late Night with David Letterman. What's My Line, To Tell the Truth, and The Today Show.

Her dedication to the industry has led to many years of selfless service, including farrier liaison for the 1984 Olympic Games, official horseshoe inspector for the Pasadena Tournament of Roses Parade, member of the California Thoroughbred Foundation Board of Directors, and presenter of various seminars.

In 2008, Ada received the Edward Martin Humanitarian Award at the American Farrier's Association Convention in Lexington, Kentucky. She recently served on the farrier committee for the

World Esquestrian Games and was inducted into the American Farriers Hall of Fame. Ada is the farrier consultant for the Online University of horse trainer Monty Roberts.

Ada's talk traces the fun run through the life - the unexpected, unique choices she made that created a passion and career beyond her dreams.

Demin Day was developed by Peace over Violence, the Denim Day campaign is observed worldwide by millions of people. As **the longest-running sexual violence prevention and education campaign**, Denim Day asks people to wear jeans as a visible way to highlight misconceptions surrounding sexual violence.

I had worn the End Polio Now shirt to Descanso Gardens just prior to the meeting. (I was there to view a memorial bench in honor of a dear friend.) As I was walking, a man on a scooter said "I like that you are wearing that shirt. Are you a Rotarian?"

Jim Lewis and I struck up a conversation. He is Polio Plus Chair for District 5240, which covers the coastal cities of Santa Barbara and Oxnard, and stretches down to Moorpark. He's also a polio survivor. He wore braces on both lower legs and has constant pain from the disease.

"Mars is the only planet entirely populated by Robots" declared our speaker today, Ms. Nagin Cox, a lead Spacecraft Operations Engineer at JPL, speaking on the JPL Mars Rovers and beyond.

President Justene rang the big brass Rotary Bell at 12:30pm and wrangled the rowdy room to order, and introduced **Eric Olson** as song leader, who was inspired by our speaker today and led us to sing "Over the Rainbow" from the Wizard of Oz. The words, most of which we knew by heart, became a challenge as the verses proceeded, due to our President (who was in charge of the laptop with the words, projected onto the overhead screen), "became transfixed on watching the club members looking up and singing the verses, not realizing that she had to scroll down to give us the next verse" as we bobbed our heads up and down trying to figure out which verse we were in as the President jiggled the scroll up and down. We still are not sure what the order of the verses are, but we finished eventually.

Mike Bernard led an inspiration on the JPL Mars Rover while waving a French copy of Magellan's voyages 500 years ago, and retelling his personal inspiration reading science fiction and fantasizing space travel and why we strive to reach into space, revealed that humans always search to learn and explore. It was a great introduction to our speaker's topic.

In honor of Administrative Professionals Day, we signed cards thanking our hard-working club administrator, **Wendy Anderson**. Maybe Wendy was waving from the Zoom camera.

George Falardeau started our program with his full introduction of Ms. Nagin Cox, an award-winning scientist of the NASA Exceptional Service Medal and the NASA Exceptional Achievement Medal twice – she even has an asteroid named after her. Ever since she was a young girl in

Kansa City, MO she wanted to be a space scientist, and after graduating Cornell and the US Air Force, she now leads several programs at JPL, a division of NASA, run by Pasadena's JPL. She was enthusiastic of the future of space travel, especially the exciting successes of the Curiosity and Perseverance Mars Rovers.



She was a great lecturer, as she introduced the club to the basics of space exploration so we could understand the processes, and then led us with several examples so we could follow the way that JPL moves the frontier of space science, from the initial mission probes to eventually, human spaceflight and maybe even "Colonization" of a foreign planet. Phase One was a "fly by", Phase Two was to orbit the planet or object, Phase Three was "In-situ", or a sample from the surface, and then Phase 4 is human exploration. The window to fly to Mars is every two years, and the time to communicate with the rovers is about 20-30 minutes, so everything must be planned with timemanagement in mind. Finally, she gave us the detailed day-to-day science of using the rovers to answer questions that planetary scientists were proposing, so the rovers are live tools for the current exploration of Mars. She sees the future of space exploration as centered on robots because they can



explore more fields and more questions at a lower cost than manned space flight, and that is the specialty of Pasadena's JPL among all the space research centers. This was a wonderful review of both the Mars Rovers we hear about all the time, and a real education of the daily lives of the scientists at the lab. It looks like the future is bright at our JPL.
