What a marvelous speaker this week! Jeff Pollack was involved in making my all-time favorite movie, *Groundhog Day.* He also spoke about the country singer, Charley Pride, singer of many hits such as *Kiss an Angel Good Morning.* He was one of my favorite singers when I was a kid. I thought the

song was about angels with wings. Pride was black. The industry tried to hide it and audiences often reacted negatively when he appeared. Jeff didn't recall which country music star stood up for Pride. I googled so you didn't have to – it was Willie Nelson.

"If you are going to play Contemporary Music – you have to play it all", said our speaker today, Producer Jeff Pollack, a multi-nominated and Oscar winning music producer. He was interviewed by member and Pasadena Media Director of Community Engagement **Jasiri Jenkins-Glen**, and it was a fascinating look at one of the most important elements of movie and television magic.

Our meeting at Altadena Country Club was rung in by **President Justene Adamec** and **Eric Olson** led us in a holiday favorite, Deck the Halls, accompanied by our lunchtime pianist Ann Louise Christiansen. **Scott Carlson's** inspiration was a reflection on how music is truly wired into





our lives and brains, and he quoted recent medical research on how music's beneficial effects to make us feel better and is important to society – it is even in this year's Rose Parade theme. Based on our speaker today who shapes movies with appropriate musical scores and songs, "music is truly a universal language.

President Justene had **David McAlexander** hold up her theme banner for the year, and reiterated her theme is not "Roll with the Punches" but is Looking at the Future. The new banner, to replace the one lost in our many moves this year, was re-printed by Dennis Juett, Jr. Our longtime member, Dennis Juett, designed and printed the banner every year until his death. His son is carrying on that service.

President Justene had a treat for us and decided that we needed to know Deborah Lewis better because she has a fascinating career that only she can best describe – so she came up and taught us a new world – the work of Live Audio Description. One of her main events is coming up, the 2024 Rose Parade, where an Audio



Descriptor helps blind and low vision people "see" the parade through visual descriptions, often without a script but using colorful visual language. Her favorite was describing live a visit to the Statue of Liberty, and she has done many television shows like Master Chef, Masked Singer, A Farmer Needs a Wife, and Lego Masters, usually found on the SAP channel on your TV. The new trend is to use an App on your phone to tune into a live event while a person is attending, for a live way to "see" and enjoy. We were amazed and look forward to hearing her voice on future shows.



President Justene then thought our speaker today was so interesting that more time was offered, and Jeff Pollack was then introduced by Jasiri Jenkins-Glen, who did a wonderful job as a live Question & Answer format presenter — many commented afterwards that she had a smooth and easy demeaner and made the speaker feel comfortable telling us the hard and special work behind the scenes of movie making. Jeff has been in radio and music production

for decades, working on movies we all have loved and remembered: You've Got Mail, Sleepless in Seattle, Love Actually, Mo' Money, and the Sinatra film "All or Nothing at All"; and is especially

proud of the work on "Glen Campbell: I'll Be Me" and the documentary "Laurel Canyon"; and his influence on steering Bryan Adams to an Oscar-nominated song "Everything I Do (I'll Do For You)". He did win an Oscar for Best Original Song "The Weary Kind" from the movie "Crazy Heart's".

Through Jasiri's eloquent questions, Jeff explained how the process of being involved in a movie or show's spirit is then left to the music producer to work with the directors and entire creative team to finish the experience, and it is not easy. He noted that the original music scored for a movie or show is usually after all the visuals are done, and a composer usually views the show for inspiration and then writes the score or choses the music that fits the mood and emphasis of the scenes. He used his recent experience working with Glen Campbell and the producers and directors of "I'll Be Me", to create a whole picture of Glen's courageous struggle with the quick onset of Alzheimer's disease, and how he couldn't remember his past family's names, but once he picked up his guitar, could play to packed houses in over 100 cities and concerts – the transformation was amazing, but we still saw how he was struggling with the debilitation process of losing his mind. All Jeff could say of the experience was "how courageous Glen was."

His life of music and personalities was colorful – he interviewed Paul McCartney in 1989, and decades later it was used in a documentary on the BBC, but he barely remembered it since he was involved with so many famous people, either alive or gone. "Laurel Canyon" was a mix of past and present interviews, Sinatra was researched, but Hip-Hop music is contemporary and live. He did comment that while we see music divided by genres and markets, today's listeners are happier with a mix of old and new, and Hip-Hop is globally more popular than ever. And some artists, like Little Nas X is across several categories, so even artists are multi-generational or multi-marketable. If you want to see Jeff's weekly "Top Five Songs" (what he is listening



to now) go to his website www.Pollackmedia.com and check them out.

Like **Scott Carlson's** inspiration today, Jeff noted that songs are emotional, and where it goes, what is says, usually make a movie be memorable and successful.


