

#### 84 Years Later Nat Read Completes all 21,400 Miles of Amtrak



Nat Read has spent a life fulfilling goals. One goal was participation in the Pasadena Rotary Club. Another was national recognition in July for completing all 22,400 miles of the passenger rail system of the U.S.A. Two weeks ago he could say he had ridden on both the northernmost (Fairbanks to Anchorage) and southernmost railroads in the Americas. (The train to the end of the world in Argentina). Other milestones have been: Visited 110 countries Visited all seven continents Stood at both poles of the earth (one of fewer than 100 people in history to do so) Flew the Goodyear Blimp, submerged in both conventional and nuclear subs **Performed** aerobatics in a sail plane (glider), bi-plane and a Navy warplane Landed on the water in a sea plane and was catapulted from an aircraft carrier Was an exchange student to the Soviet Union by train through what is now Ukraine, Georgia, Uzbekistan, Czech Republic, Slovakia, East and West Germany and

Poland

Was arrested by the KGB
Held news conferences for Ronald Reagan, Jesse Owens, Perry Como, etc., etc.
Marched with Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.
Retired as a U.S. Navy captain
Wrote six books, and articles in dozens of magazines and newspapers, including g the Wall Street Journal, Reader's Digest, and L.A. Times

**Jennifer DeVoll** introduced our speaker. Juan Bastos is an internationally-renowned portrait painter who was born in Bolivia, grew up in Bolivia, and came to the United States when he enrolled in Georgetown University in 1979.

Juan started his presentation by showing us a video of the history of portrait painting by art historian Raichel Le Goff, showing the evolution from profiles to full-figure images. You can see it here:

Speaking of his own motives for painting portraits, Juan explained, "It's a magic act – creating the illusion of life in two dimensions." He said, "Photography can reproduce, but the artist reinterprets!"

We were treated to a survey of some of his favorite subjects:

- Author Gore Vidal
- Actress Patricia Morison, whom he painted when she was 99 years old
- Artist Don Bachardy, whom he painted in front of a portrait of Bachardy's partner Christopher Isherwood
- The late Charlie Munger, whom he painted in his 90s, and who "wanted to look MUCH younger!"

Other tidbits:

- Painting children is very hard because you don't want the finished product to be too sentimental. You have to find the balance so that the portrait is "pleasing without being over the top."
- Juan painted portraits of many prominent art collectors, and he likes to pose them in front of one of their favorite paintings. Here is an example: https://www.juanbastos.com/w1.htm
- Sometimes he is asked to alter a portrait after it is finished. He showed us a lovely portrait of a young girl that he altered to add her beloved pet dog.
- When painting a family portrait with two children, Juan suggested making a diptych (a set of two paintings) so that when the children grew up, they could each inherit the painting of themselves with one parent.
- One of Juan's clients asked to have herself painted in the style of the Virgin Mary and the Annunciation. It turned out very dramatic with New York's Central Park in the background! https://www.juanbastos.com/g3.htm



 It's possible to paint from photos, but it's very helpful to have at least one session with the subject sitting live for the painter. Fun fact: Juan often borrows the subject's clothing and has it on a mannequin while he paints.

After reviewing many of his portraits (which can be seen at *www.juanbastos.com*, we had a lively Q and A session in which we learned that Juan has painted 340 commissioned portraits and perhaps another 160 or so for himself, for a total of about 500 paintings over his career!



**President Justene** presented Juan with his speaker gift and the meeting was adjourned to great applause at 1:30.


# RYLA IS BACK!!!!
