Vladyslav Golyk "Rescuing Animals Affected by War in Ukraine"

Introducer: Nevino Rocco



Born and raised in Kharkiv, Ukraine, Vlad has been living in the US since 2010 when he moved here to pursue his PhD in Physics at MIT. He currently lives in Los Angeles where he is a partner with McKinsey & Company.

With his immediate family living in Ukraine when war first broke out, Vlad has been close to various efforts to support Ukraine. His parents, who were stuck in the basement of an apartment building when the war started, were holding for their lives under heavy Russia artillery and rockets. They eventually were able to get evacuated to nearby Poland.

Since then, and almost by accident, Vlad has been involved in rescuing abandoned pets. He has been

supporting a grassroots group of about forty volunteers who dedicated their livelihoods to this task.

Vlad will be sharing interesting stories about his efforts with Ukraine that will give us a better idea of the situation on the ground and how such efforts make an enormous difference.


Some firsts - the RYLA scholars are coming to the meeting on April 10 and in June, we're presenting our first Paul Harris community award.

President Justene, on behalf of **Past President Cory Brendel**, announced a cleanup project in the Arroyo on April 6. Details below. She then turned things over to **Bill Tilney**, co-chair of the Four Way Test Speech Contest.

First Bill reminded us of the origin of Rotary's famous Four Way



Test of everything we think, say, or do:

Is it the TRUTH? Will it be FAIR to all concerned? Will it build GOOD WILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS? Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?

This test was originated by Rotarian and future Rotary International President Herbert J. Taylor in 1932 and has been going strong ever since. You can read more about the history, in Herb's own words, here: https://rotary5630.org/history-of-the-fourway-test/

Next, **Bill** explained that today was the Group Round, which followed the Club Round, which took place in February. He acknowledged the Pasadena, Altadena, and San Marino Rotarians who participated in the earlier rounds, including co-chair **David McAlexander, Mike Bernard, Robert Lyons**, Altadena's Mark Mariscal and Roger McKee, and San Marino's Ginny Hsiao (who is also the chair of the Four Way Speech Contest for the entire District 5300).

PP Mary Lou Byrne introduced the distinguished judges for today's round:

Jan Sanders has been a Rotarian since 1997 and a member here since 2006. She has served as committee chair and leader of Rotary Readers. She spent the last 12 years of her happy and productive career as Director of Pasadena's 10 libraries. What fun! Although retired in 2016, Jan stays active through the community panel leading the update of the



Central Library. She's also on the Pasadena Community Media Board and does daily water aerobics at the Rose Bowl Pool. Jan lives in Pasadena and enjoys spending time with her family including her daughter and granddaughter. She told the Committee "I'm eager to hear what these outstanding young people have to share."

Abraham Meltzer is a Superior Court Judge, presently assigned to a criminal courtroom in Pasadena. You may remember him from his presentation on "Fraud as Hyperreality" at our August 18, 2023 Rotary meeting. Before taking the bench, he worked at the U.S. Attorney's Office in Los Angeles for 17 years, where he was Chief of the Civil Fraud Section. Among other matters, he supervised the team that in 2020 recovered \$2 billion from Wells Fargo Bank for opening millions of fake accounts without its customers' authorization. Most notably, though, in 1982, he was the Rotary Club of Banning's Four-Way Speech Contest winner. He lives in Glendale with his wife and has two grown children.

Scott Phelps is a longtime friend of Pasadena Rotary, dating back to his selection as a PUSD Teacher of Excellence way back in 2001, when he was a math and science teacher at Muir High School. He was elected to the Pasadena Unified School Board in 2005 and served for 17 years. After leaving the board in December 2022, Scott went back to teaching in the PUSD, at its Center for Independent Study school. As he explains it, "Students take online courses, I mentor them through them, tutor them, push them along, lots of communicating with them. I enjoy it." Scott has also taught in the College of Education at Cal State LA and served as an advisor to teacher credential candidates at Claremont Graduate University, Cal State Northridge and Mt. St. Mary's College. He has also worked as a consultant in the program evaluation of schools and districts across California. He and his wife also live in Pasadena and have two grown children.

Our first contestant was London Gray, an aspiring filmmaker who is a sophomore at Pasadena High School and hopes to attend USC film school. She was representing the Rotary Club of Altadena and her speech was about the epidemic of missing black women and children, and California's recent institution of the Ebony Alert to make it easier to help find them.

The second contestant, Sarah Lin, is senior at Southwestern Academy in San Marino and represented the Rotary Club of San Marino. She speaks six languages and hopes to attend college abroad and study business. Her speech was about even though we are living "in a time of unprecedented crises," creating hope in the world can achieve a better future.

Finally, Paulina McConnell, a junior at Pasadena High School, represented the Pasadena Rotary Club. She hopes to study environmental science and her speech was about climate change and the fact that 80% of climate refugees are women.

While the judges were tallying the scores, each contestant introduced herself and her guests. All the contestants brought at least one parent, and they also brought the teachers who encouraged them to enter the contest.

When the judges came back, the results were announced. The two runners-up each received a check for \$200, while the first-place winner received a check for \$400. Each contestant also received a certificate of achievement.

The winners were: Third place, London Gray (Altadena Rotary), Second place Sarah Lin (San Marino Rotary), First place Paulina McConnell (Pasadena Rotary). Paulina will advance to the Group Round next month and hopefully to the finals in May.
