What happens when a major donor bequeaths the Huntington Garden with a gift to provide a traditional Japanese Tea House to the Japanese Garden area? You go find a 320-year-old residence and garden in perfect condition in Marugame, Japan, have it disassembled and brought to Pasadena, CA' and re-build it, exactly like it was in Japan. Our speaker today, Huntington Garden's **Robert Hori**, took us on his journey of bringing this treasure to the Garden, and what it means to all involved.

Today was the first day in a long time that the University Club provided the delicious lunch – enjoying lunch at noon with fellow Rotarians is a highlight of the week.

President Justene Adamec rang the Rotary Bell at 12:30pm and our own PP Phil Miles on guitar and harmonica, accompanied by Board member Don Andrues on guitar and Major Roy Wild on snappy tambourine led us on a rousing chorus of Oh! Suzanna (by Stephen Foster, 1948). Lisa Kroese, inspired by our speaker and Japanese cultural treasures, spoke to us of a revered Japanese poet, Otagaki Rengetsu, who inscribed Haiku poems into her ceramic bowls. PP Mary Lou Byrne introduced our speaker today, Robert Hori, of the Huntington Garden, and his presentation was on the new-to-Huntington Garden, the 320-year-old Japanese Heritage Shoya House. Robert started his presentation by thanking the San Marino League for their support. One of the ladies of the League, Ms. Mary Lee, had lived in Japan after WW II and wanted to protect the Japanese garden at the Huntington against the post-war anti-Japanese sentiment, observing that "gardens are a place of peace" and that there should be a tea house, too. She then told the Garden that she would build them one, and upon her death her estate bequeathed the funds to create the new tea house and garden,



direct from Japan.



The search for the perfect house and garden resulted in the owners of the Shoya house wanting to give it a second life, as they were not interested in living in it, but wanted to preserve its long history and beautiful gardens. "Mottainai" is a Japanese phrase of feelings of remorse, or regret, and that extends to resources, materials, or opportunities. The decision to move the house and garden intact to Pasadena, for use as a cultural center and home was like its role in the village in Marugame, and after getting approval of local officials and neighbors, it was finally disassembled in 2019 and moved to Pasadena area for reassembly and garden replanting.

Then the Pandemic hit, and the parts sat outdoors for almost a year, threatening the entire project with ruin if it was not rebuilt to withstand the Southern California sun. We watched as the many steps to rebuild it to both Japanese and American

standards forced the construction to re-think 300-year-old design and modern earthquake standards to everyone's satisfaction, but the Huntington is diligent to make it work, and the result was a beautiful building and authentic Japanese garden of peace that we can all enjoy.

Perhaps we need to have a Rotary Day at the Huntington Gardens to welcome this new civic and cultural jewel to our city?


