American historian and local author Ronald C. White will lecture on his recent book, "On Great Fields: Joshua Chamberlain: The life and Unlikely Heroism of Joshua Lawrence Chamberlain.†White's book recounts Chamberlain's revered heroism in the Battle of Gettysburg as he led his regiment to victory at Little Round Top. While this is Chamberlain's renowned achievement, White's book explores Chamberlain beyond his role in the Civil War, including his formative years as an innovative professor at Bowdoin University.
