MARCH 7 PROGRAM RECAP International Committee Update

San Marino Rotary has one of the most active and most experienced international committees in our district. Committee Chair J.P. Mainguy briefed the club on the many international projects we are involved with. Heart2Heart Phase IV, is targeting 28 children in Egypt who have congenital heart disease that can be treated with catheter intervention. Already, 100 children have been treated and over 200 doctors and nurses in Northern Egypt have been trained in this type of medicine. District 5300 is the international sponsor of this \$77,000 project, raising funds from over 24 clubs with matching from funds from our district and Rotary International and working with the El Tahrir Rotary Club in Egypt. Our club, because of its expertise and training in international grants, helps vet, manage, and follow up on the disbursement of funds to the project in Egypt. We are also involved with a \$42K project with the Rotary Club of Panipal, India to provide 4 dialysis systems.

Project Corazon is an annual district-wide project that builds a home in a day for a deserving family in Tecate, Mexico. Many of our members have participated in this hands-on international project. Club members have gone to Tijuana to view the soccer field and the kindergarten we have supported and have also traveled to Cambodia to view the aquaponics project that helps families grow fish.

Shody Chow is the district representative. Other committee members are Stephanie Johnson, Qing Duncan, Mary Ulin, Michel Roy, Jeff Wang, Aaron Gil, Isaac Hung and Denise Wadsworth.






MOTOR CLASSIC SPONSORSHIP OPPORTUNITIES
