Valeria was born in Sevastopol, Crimea. But when Russian forces occupied that region in 2014 she fled to Kiev, where she earned her university degrees. Then, when Russia invaded Ukraine-proper in 2022, she fled with her mother to Italy, then Poland and finally to the United States. Valeria visited our club two years ago. At the time, she had no job, no car, and no work permit. People of this community, including several Rotarians, helped Valeria get on her feet. Teddy and Nicole Basseri provided her with a car, Fary with dental work, Ginny with legal help and Dennis let her live in his ADU for 10 months. Now Valeria lives in Pasadena. Not only does she have a work permit, but she has a key role in a movie, called SHTTL, that will come out next month. Rotarians help many people through the on-going programs we have on the local, district and international levels. But Rotarians also help informally when they see a need. This is one of those examples.
