# **Membership Corner: Corporate Memberships can** grow your club

District Membership Chair, Gilda Moshir asked President Justene Ademec to share her club's success with Corporate Memberships. This is what she shares:

We have eight corporate members and 28 corporate alternates. Some of the corporate members are individuals who would not have joined or stayed without the corporate membership option. In other words, they would have left if there was no option for someone in their organization to attend meetings. Three members have been explicit about this. Of the 28 alternates, we cannot identify a single one who would have joined if their company had not signed them up. We have at least 31 members who would not have been part of Rotary if we didn't have the corporate membership. Some alternates are already involved in committees, have attended social events and participated in service projects. We are actively working with others to find a role for them. I highly recommend your clubs to consider offering Corporate Memberships if you are looking to expand your membership.
