**Stu Ledsam**â€<sup>™</sup>s family emigrated from Australia and became Naturalized U.S. Citizens. He was raised in Beaumont, a town of 4500 people. As a boy, he worked on ranches, picked fruit, and cleaned horse stalls. Later, Stuâ€<sup>™</sup>s parents moved into the city so the boys could attend a university. He began by attending junior college where he excelled in wrestling and studied Chemistry and Mathematics. From there, he earned his way into UCLA, found rugby, and was on the team that won 2 national championships. In 1974, he moved to Long Beach and founded the Belmont Shore Rugby Club, now the best USA team.

In 1983, he started his business and was one of the first contractors in California to earn his Hazardous Materials Certification. He worked for numerous large corporations and the US Army Corp of Engineers to clean up military bases such as Marine Corp Training Depot, Camp Pendleton, Joint Forces in Los Alamitos, Camp Roberts, Hamilton Field, Naval Air Station North Island, POLB, POLA, etc.

In 2018, Stu married Paula, the most wonderful woman on the planet. They have four children: Kyle, Amanda, Hilary, and Kendra. The girls were a little stressful, but he survived. The girls have made up for the torment by delivering six grandchildren.

Stu has been on the Los Altos YMCA Board for 7 years, was its Fundraiser for 4 years, and led the campaign raising a total of 1 Million Dollars.

To add to Stu's fundraising resume, in 2022, he decided to create long-term funding for the Belmont Shore Rugby Club and by year-end raised \$350,000.

Jon got involved in Bike racing and was the Junior National Downhill Mountain Bike Champion at 18 years old and Captain of the US Junior team at the World Championships.

Jon moved to the Southern CA beaches in 2002 to pursue a professional beach volleyball career at age 28. In 2006 he was a Nominee for AVP Rookie of the Year. He continues to play on the professional circuit today. Jon is also a former Commercial Pilot.

Jon is currently the Executive Director of the nonprofit, Long Beach Blast, which was founded 22 years ago on the dream of providing academic and personal mentorship to the most disadvantaged youth in Long Beach. They work year-round to help over 1,000 youth to learn basic life skills, goal setting, and character development.

Prior to arriving at Blast 18 months ago, Jon was the first and largest Franchisee of six Rock and Brews restaurants and worked with rock star Gene Simmons of the band KISS. They were successful in building a Rock and Brews in 100 days. He also opened Serve on Second in Hermosa Beach.

When not playing volleyball he likes to watch his 16 year old son, Logan, play football at Rolling Hills Prep. He lives in Hermosa Beach on the Strand near the famous Mesko courts…always ready for a pick up game.

His favorite movie is *Ace Ventura* and is a world class expert on any line from the TV series *Seinfeld*! He is also a solid poker player.


