President Kim called on Nicole Sturk to introduce our newest Rotarian, Jack Omer, a native Daytonian and graduate of Alter High School who is the new President/CEO of SICSA Pet Adoption and Wellness Center

Chair of the Day, Dave Williamson was called on to introduce our speaker, Karen Bradley, Immigration Lawyer with Bradley & Assoc.

Program: A Snapshot of the Immigration Crisis

Ms. Bradley who deals more with the day-to-day boot-on-ground actions of immigration rather than from the view of a lawmaker, provided perspective on how dire the situation is at the southern borders of the United States due to a lack of resources, planning, and low employment rates

It was shared that there are approximately 33 million undocumented and unemployed immigrants living in the United States without any health benefits. Ms. Bradley shared a personal story of her own that she too has family members from Belize who have been seeking asylum in the U.S. since 2007.

She later fielded questions on back practices at the Canadian borders and some other countries, of which she noted that the United States has a good process, but it is not being managed properly.
