President Kim Bramlage then came to podium and asked for a volunteer to be the audio-visual coordinator for the club. After many years at the helm, Steve Naas is stepping away from the job. Jean Maychack then introduced Andy Clements, Dayton Rotaryâe™s new member. He is in the banking industry and works at Minster Bank. Andy is to be married in June, has a dog named Linus, and is an Eagle Scout. Shannon Bozeman and Jeremy Turner discussed the Red Ribbon Takeover Day (April 22) and described the "It Takes a Village" fundraising project. Specifically, the funds raised provide in need children's items to help them regulate their emotions, including drum sets, bubble tubes, and fidget toys.

Frank Scott then presented a \$3000 Dayton Rotary Foundation Grant to Michael Vanderburgh, the Executive Director of St Vincent de Paul Society (SVDP). Michael was the day's speaker. He is a longtime Oakwood Rotarian. He explained that SVDP is a lay association of the Catholic Church and was founded in the 1800's. Locally, there are 30 neighborhood organizations with 600 volunteers. The goal is to provide shelter but, ultimately to keep folks in their homes and to pay their bills. The SVDP runs the City Thrift store, which serves as a furniture bank that assists our local homeless shelters. Since 1986, the SVDP has operated shelters 24/7 for those locally who are experiencing homelessness. On average, these shelters accommodate 4000 men, women, and children per year. Our area has some of the largest shelters in the country and has found room for those in need since 2009. On average, the shelters can accommodate 500 people per night. The most common self-reported reasons for homelessness are mental health issues, family conflicts and evictions. Many times, there is more than one reason for homelessness.

In 2023, the SDVP saw a spike in women and children experiencing homelessness. SDVP relies on public funding, private monetary donations, and car donations. While the SDVP largely relies on volunteers to complete its mission, there are now 160 employees. We were encouraged to visit their website for volunteer opportunities. Private donations allow SDVP to operate its shelters.

Michael then reflected on the causes of homelessness and what can be done about it. We have all heard about one of the root causesâE"the lack of affordable housing. Michael shared that currently nearly 300,000 housing units are needed to address the homelessness problem, which equates to four billion dollars. He also believes that the use of technology, including cell phones and social media, has led to fragmentation in our society. That phenomenon is also seen in shelters. One of the first things we all can do is love one another and be willing to put the need of others above

Finally, Michael entertained questions from the group. He explained that the Dayton shelters do not turn many folks away and welcome those in need from other counties. Everyone is loved and is welcome. It has become more difficult to find shelters that will take single fathers with children. SVDP also refers some of its clients to DayBreak and the YWCA depending on the specific needs of those clients. While there is no laws or barriers to sheltering, there are rules in the shelters including, no violence, no anti-social behavior, no substance abuse, and those with mental health issues are often referred to other resources.

Michael then drew the ticket for Queen of Hearts and Richard Lundin drew a Jack. So, there was no winner this week and the pot is at about \$1000. Shannon Bozeman led us in the Four Way Test. Next week's speaker will be Mike Miller from the Dakota Center.

The meeting was adjourned.




