History of Rotary- what's in a name?

Have you ever wondered why Rotary is called Rotary, or where the Rotary emblem came from?



In 1905, when Rotary was formed, the members called it "Rotary" to describe the practice of *rotating* the meeting place at the members' businesses.

1905, slowly adjusting over the years to become a standardized gear wheel in 1919, with a central keyway added in 1924. The emblem was designed to reflect strength, power and action.
