PROGRAM

Molly Ingold introduced **Jim Roberts**, Executive Director of the Southwest Licking Community Water and Sewer District ("The District"). The District was established in 1989 to eliminate environmental pollution problems in Etna, Harrison and Lima Townships (now City of Pataskala). The District provides centralized water and wastewater services to residential and commercial customers in these areas. Since its creation, it has experienced rapid growth, currently servicing over 6,700 water customers and over 7,000 wastewater customers.

Jim became Executive Director of the District in the Fall of 2023 after working for Jobes Henderson for 29 years and serving the public in various capacities. The District is a separate political subdivision. It's an independent legal authority, managed by a 3-member board, with 1 person appointed from each municipal entity.

The Licking Co. Commissioners created Sewer District No. 9 in 2002 in response to the expansion of SR 161. A 2010 agreement said the District would cover part of the 161 corridor.

The January 2022 Intel announcement prompted a new agreement that saw the District's service area double overnight with a need to increase capacity by 3x or 4x with an accelerated timeline and a sense of urgency from state leaders.

Jim noted that there are several major projects in the works in response to growth demands. They are both increasing capacity at existing plants and building new facilities with the hope to increase wastewater capacity from 2.65 million gallons a day to 9.8 million gallons per day in 3 years, and to increase water treatment capacity from about 3 million gallons a day to more than 5 MGD. There are many obstacles, but the most significant challenge is finding resources (water).

Jim noted that the District has state-of-the-art facilities. The District is collaborating with local governmental entities, and that was a major impetus in the District hiring **Jim** in the first place. The District's anticipated capital expenditures for the next 20 years are about \$310mm in water expenditures and \$370mm for sanitary / wastewater.
