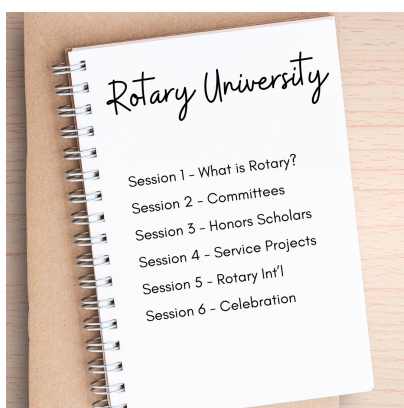

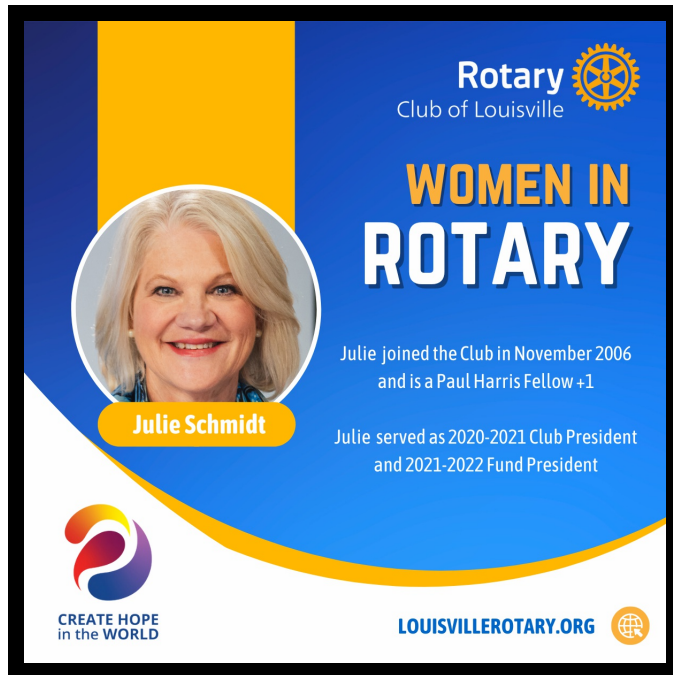

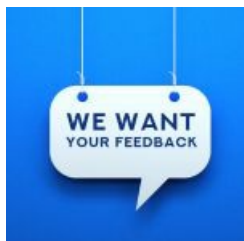


Rotarian in the Spotlight: Lori Hudson Flanery & David Snyder


