

IN MEMORIAM: Graham Rapp



Long-time former Rotarian **Graham Walter Rapp** died peacefully on November 28 at the age of 92 at Nazareth Home. He was born in Louisville on April 6, 1931 to the late Walter and Eloise (Muth) Rapp. Graham served in the military during the Korean War as a member of the Airforce Engineers stationed at Craig Air Force Base. In 1958, he joined the architectural firm of Arrasmith and Judd in Louisville, becoming a principal in 1965. He went on to serve as President of Arrasmith, Judd, Rapp, Inc., enjoying a career spanning over 50 years.

Graham was a member of our Club from September 1975 until June 2011.


