

# T. Damo Damodaran: Prospective Member

Damo started out as a participant in Rotary Youth Camp (now known as RYLA). He was a founding charter member of the Rotaract Club of Coimbatore (India) in 1974. He was sponsored by Rotary International District 320 as a Rotary Foundation Ambassadorial Scholar to study at Case Western Reserve University, Cleveland, Ohio, USA in 1976.

Upon further scholarship and graduation, Damo began his career in the financial industry. He was invited to, and



joined Heights of Greater Cleveland Rotary Club and the following year he transferred to Berea (Ohio) Rotary Club, where he served as Club President in 1983-84. He served in District Rotary Foundation and World Community Service committees prior to being elected as District 6630 Governor in 1988-89. At the Zone level, he served in various committees, including multi-district PETS and as chair of Governor-Elect Training Seminar (GETS) program.

At the International level, Damo has served as RI President's Representative, as a member of Preserve Planet Earth Committee, as USCB Coordinator for Rotaract Task Force, and as a delegate to the Council on Legislation. In 2006, Damo moved to Southern California and joined Redlands Sunrise Rotary Club where he served as Club President (2019-20) and as member orientation coordinator. He had the pleasure of hosting Youth Exchange students, Group Study Exchange team (GSE), Vocational Training Team (VTT), Friendship Exchange team members. He served as District 5330 Chairman of Rotaract Committee, Rotary Foundation Alumni Association, and Strategic Planning Committee. Damo is a retired Financial Advisor.


