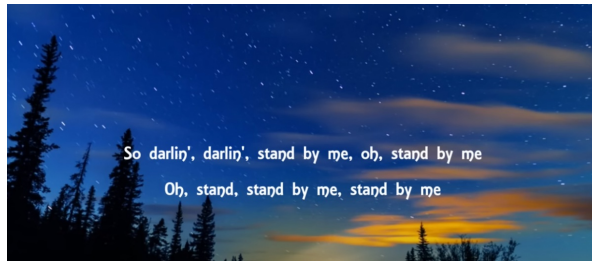
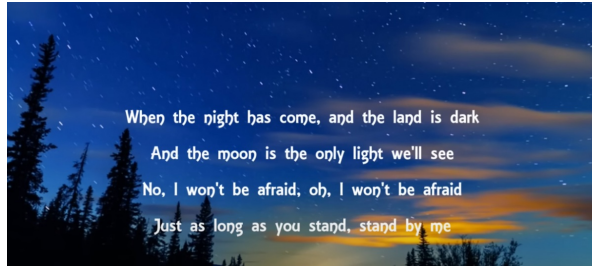

Social Work and Social Justice

After earning a master's in social work from the University of Kentucky, Chris Groeber helped develop Kentucky's Public Child Welfare Certification program that ensures aspiring bachelor's in social work students gain experiences with Kentucky's Public Child Welfare Agency before working as a public child welfare worker. For 30 years, Chris has taught extensively about child welfare policy development and practice. He has been the principal investigator on one of the nation's first Quality Improvement Centers focused on frontline supervision in child welfare.

Among Chris's many child welfare roles, he most recently served as the United States CEO of Key Assets, an international child caring organization. His primary focus was working with children with profound autism who have been traumatized. He has developed businesses and loves the idea of social entrepreneurship. He has worked in several countries during his tenure including living a year Chelyabinsk, Russia in Siberia.

Chris's focus at USF is helping students gain both an appreciation for and understanding of Social Work practice and the interplay of social justice. He believes that self-reflective practice is key to being a solid and just social worker. Chris maintains interest in policy, staff development, coaching, leadership, and supervision. He enjoys working with students who are innovative and seek to change the world by improving the lives of children and their families.

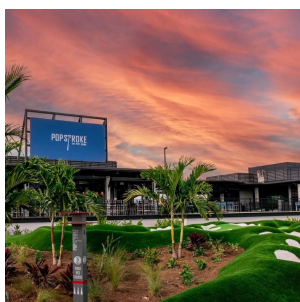



There are several awards that can be attained by a Club or individual through Rotary. Now is the time to make your nomination! The awards are:

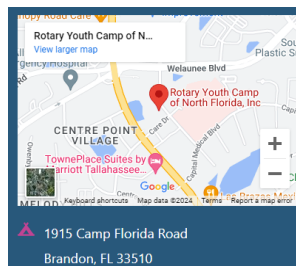
1. Rotary Foundation District Service Award. This award honors Rotarians and Rotaractors who are making a difference through the Foundation's programs, promoting the Rotary Foundation and its goals of world understanding and peace. Members can be nominated by their Clubs to the District Rotary Foundation Chair Mark Scolnick at markscolnick@district6890@gmail.com. The Chair will then make recommendations to the District Governor. Nomination Deadline is May 1, 2024.
2. Avenues of Service Award. (District Level). The Avenues of Service Award recognizes the efforts of individual Rotarians and Rotaractors in each of Rotary's 5 Avenues of Service. Current Club Presidents can nominate a member for one or more Avenues of Service Awards by completing this nomination form online: https://rotary.qualtrics.com/jfe/form/SV_4V0rQ6m6qu9pj. See these examples of eligible service activities: <https://my-cms.rotary.org/en/document/avenues-service-award-examples-eligible-service-activities>. Nomination Deadline is May 1, 2024.

The District Governor is notified of the nomination and will decide on the award.

1. Significant Service Award. This award recognizes Rotary and Rotaract Clubs for projects that made an impact and gives District recognition to Club activities that address a significant problem or need. Club Presidents can use this online nomination form: https://rotary.qualtrics.com/jfe/form/SV_55CFsyWTWcwhQh to send a project description to the District Governor for any project carried out during the year. The Governor makes the decision on the award. Eligibility criteria: Rotary and Rotaract Clubs that have completed projects that made an impact are eligible for recognition. Nomination Deadline is May 1, 2024.
2. Please remember our most important award for Rotary Clubs, the Rotary Citation for Rotary Clubs. Many Clubs have already been working towards this citation all year. 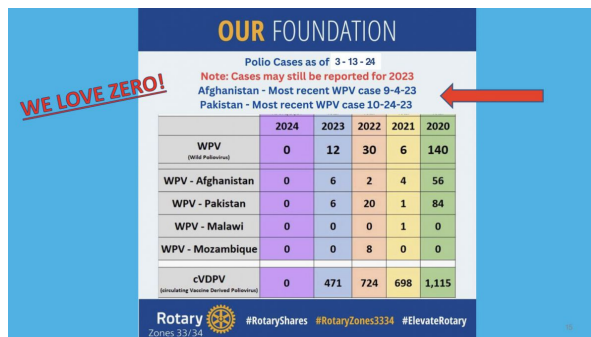
