Progress in BQK and History/celebrations of the Torras Causeway



Daren spoke about the Brunswick Landing Marina and the future of Brunswick. He mentioned a few historical events important to the development of the Golden Isles and Torras Properties. In 1788 Glynn Academy was created. In 1789 George Washington named Brunswick as Primary Port of Entry. The building of liberty ships during WWII brought many people to the area. In 1978 Robert M Torras acquired Kut Kwick and began acquiring the land to build the marina

starting in 1994.

Rosendo Torras came to the Brunswick area from Spain and began shipping lumber in the late 1800s. He travelled often on his ships and became a commercial diplomat recognized by Grover Cleveland and Teddy Roosevelt. He was also knighted by the king of Sweden.

The Brunswick Landing Marina was originally a dumping ground. The Torras family started cleaning it up and started building the first pier sections. The Emerald Princess tied up there and helped get the business started. There are now 17 docks that hold 350-400 vessels.

Daren is excited about the amount of money coming into downtown Brunswick starting in 2018. There are new restaurants and businesses as well a focus on affordable housing and resolving crime issues, and attracting more skilled workers.

Torras Properties has been working with many community organizations on the 100th anniversary of the F.J. Torras Causeway. There will be a parade on Newcastle Street and a crossing of the causeway that will end in Gascoigne Bluff.
