IMAGINATION LIBRARY

The Rotary Club of College Park became a partner with the Dollywood Foundation in 2012, and since that time, has distributed almost 40,000 books to families in ZIP codes 32804, 32805, 32808, and 32810 – at no cost to the parents!

Currently more than 700 local preschool children are receiving books each month through the Imagination Library, but there are thousands more children eligible in the four ZIP codes that



could benefit from Imagination Library. The club has received grants from local partners, Florida Citrus Sports Foundation, United Way of Central Florida, and Early Learning Coalition of Orange County, but it is important that we also have broad community support.

We are launching an initiative to get 100 new donors at \$11 per month. This will provide funding for 500 children or 6,000 books for the year. One time donations are also welcome. You are invited to be a part of this group by going to www.cprbooks.com.


CLUB DONATES IMAGINATION LIBRARY BOOKS TO LOCAL PRESCHOOL PROGRAMS

ROTARY HISTORY - ROTARY BECOMES INTERCONTINENTAL

On August 1, 1912, the Rotary Club of London, Greater London, England, became the first Rotary club in Europe. Although Rotary had already become international in April of that year with the chartering of the Rotary Club of Winnipeg, Manitoba, Canada, the club in the United Kingdom earned Rotary the distinction of being an intercontinental organization.

After the London members organized the club, it took a year to receive its charter. Correspondence between General Secretary Chesley R. Perry and charter member Arthur P. Bigelow reveals some of the club members' questions about joining and paying dues to what was then the National Association of Rotary Clubs, made up of only U.S. clubs.

Perry encouraged them to "forget that the word 'national' is in the name," noting that if Winnipeg, London, and others were to join, the association would "simply have to change its name to the Inter-National Association.'

In addition to the many awards the organization has received, several milestones have been celebrated throughout the years. With each goal achieved, a new one takes its place, creating an ever growing and expanding organizational culture, much like that of Dolly's always-keep-dreaming mindset. As of January 2024, Dolly and her team of sponsors like the College Park Rotary Club have delivered almost 230 million books! That's right, 230 million! In Central Florida, our club has delivered over 35,000 books since we started in 2012
