



I borrowed the above chart and information from www.my.rotary.org to circulate amongst all my fellow Rotarians in our District to show some statistics related to Foundation on global basis. Even though this information is for a period 2014 - 2019, the ratios and proportions are quite relevant even today. It is interesting to see how United States was the highest and India the second highest givers of the world for five years period, but the US was the sixth highest per capita donor and India was not in the top six countries mentioned. There were \$87 million spent in one year on Global Grants, whereas in a five year period \$151.8 million were spent on Global Grants for disease prevention and treatment area of focus alone. Enjoy learning more about the specific area you wish to in terms of giving or spending. November is a Foundation month. Let us make a difference by giving to Annual Fund this month and help the graph move upwards.

# District Rotary Foundation Committee

#### DDF EXPLAINED & DISTRICT 6990 FOUNDATION HEALTH END DECEMBER 2023

District Designated Fund, (DDF) is the sum of DDF from Annual Fund, DDF from Endowment Fund and unused DDF brought forward from the previous year. Annual Fund contributed by the District as a whole is invested for a three year's period and thereafter fifty percent returned to the District after deducting up to 5% for management charges and fifty per cent is held with The Rotary Foundation (TRF) as World Fund (WF). Similarly, Endowment Fund received from the District is also invested but in this case only the earning from the investment is sent to the respective District in same proportions as DDF and WF.

In the Year 2020-2021 District 6990 contributed \$284,206.80 toward Annual Fund (AF), \$83956.25 towards Polio Plus (PP), \$277,078.10 towards Endowment Fund (ED) and \$ 94,004.00 towards Other Fund. DDF received in 2023 - 2024 with only 2.25% deduction for management costs.

#### **GLOBAL GRANTS**

We encourage you to use up all the DDF remaining by writing more grant applications, thus doing more projects in the community. At District 6990, we match your Club giving at dollar to dollar up to \$10,000. The Rotary Foundation matches 80% of DDF as WF. For a Global Grant, the total Grant size should be minimum \$30,000, maximum any amount. You can collaborate with any number of Clubs within the District or outside our District anywhere world wide. We match contributions from the Clubs in our District, again up to \$10K.

#### **GIVING HEALTH**

As of 20 December 2023 total contributed in our District 6990 towards Annual Fund is \$60,577.69, 29.71 % of our goal of \$203,920.00. We generally surpass our goal and at this time we should be crossing 50% of our goal. If your Club is one of those pulling this percentage down, please send your funds across to the Rotary Foundation. Simply log on to www.my.rotary.org click donate and choose the box labelled Annual Fund - SHARE. Very simple. Similarly for Polio Plus choose Polio Plus box. Our present contribution is \$17,648 towards Polio Plus, \$24,000 towards Other Funds and \$145,000 towards Endowment. By the time you read this it will be January. Nevertheless, please proceed pay your share and pull the totals up.

#### FOUNDATION INFORMATION SESSIONS

For the benefit of all the members, we are providing monthly sessions whereby you can exchange information related to the Foundation - District Grants, Global Grants, Polio Plus, Applications, Reports, details, Annual Fund, Paul Harris Fellow, Golf Ball Drop, Stewardship and all that goes with it. 

#### Information about the planting location:

NORTH POINTE COMMUNITY CENTER is located at 7351 NW 186th St., just north of Hialeah, FL 33015. The park used to be part of the YMCA, but is now managed by MIAMI-DADE PARKS. We will plant native trees, Jamaican Capers. Despite their name, Jamaican Capers, they are native Florida trees that are a larval host for the Florida White butterfly.

We will also plant several Rain Gardens. Rain Gardens are a basin designed to capture and infiltrate storm water runoff. This diverts and absorbs pollutants from the parking lot runoff.


The date of this tree planting coincides with Florida Arbor Day, is right after Tu BiShvat, and close to Valentine's Day. You may want to use these commemorations for your dedications.

Our District is growing it's Rotarian Forest, and we have planted over 1,000 trees since we started.

I hope that everyone will join in this activity in some manner. BTW, you do not need to be present to plant your tree(s), and planting trees is open to all, regardless if you have purchased or not a tree.

# POSITIVE PEACE BUILDING

Peace and Love are one of the greatest forces on Earth.

On Thursday, October 26th, 2023; the Rotary Clubs of Grand Bahama led by Area Governor Othyneil Pinder and a delegation of Rotarians took the Administration, Faculty & Staff of The Beacon School in a transformative Peace Building & Conflict Resolution Session.

The workshop allowed for a platform of sharing in a judgement free zone. The work of the team allowed for layers to be peeled back among the staff. Participants left with a greater understanding of each other as well as an appreciation for their individual backgrounds.

The Rotary Organization is credited with bringing about a positive change on the campus among the adult staff which will undoubtedly trickle down to the students and the wider community – through the use of the Share America tools.

Peace and conflict resolution are fundamental aspects of creating stable societies and fostering positive relationships between individuals and communities. Peace, in its essence, signifies the absence of violence, discord, and hostility. It embodies a state of harmony and tranquility where people coexist peacefully, respecting one another's rights, beliefs, and differences. Achieving peace requires open communication, empathy, and a willingness to understand diverse perspectives. It involves fostering mutual understanding and promoting social justice, equality, and human rights. These tenants were on full display during the session.

Conflict resolution, on the other hand, is the process of addressing disputes, disagreements, or clashes in a constructive manner.
