

From 1994 until 2018, Phillip worked for three different councils (Richmond, VA, Newport News, VA and Bethesda, MD) of the Boy Scouts



In 2018, Phillip went to the Alumni Engagement office at Mary Washington. His responsibilities include regional networks, affinity groups, alumni support of admissions initiatives, athletics alumni and the Mary Talks series.

In 2019, with more than two decades of experience in event planning and managing volunteers, Duggins was hired to engage Mary Washington's 41,000 alumni globally and help them feel connected to their alma mater. Organized by UMW's 22 regional alumni networks and 10 affinity groups, events were mostly held in person before COVID hit.

at the site. Within 45 minutes, participants registered for all 100 spots, so organizers added a second tour, which also filled up quickly, drawing alumni from as far away as San Diego.

Lena gave some background on the library project. A Girl Scout from Fredericksburg Christian School, working on her Gold Award, collected over 1,600 books in Spanish, in English and in both. She was also able to travel to la Paz with the group of volunteers. Lena explained the moneysaving method of shipping all the library supplies. The volunteers only took clothes that would fit into one carryon bag. The checked luggage all contained books, Legos, toys, etc. Donna said it took some careful planning to have enough clothes.



She described the area being served by this library.

Although the capital city San Salvador has a magnificent new public library, there are very few libraries in suburban and rural areas.

The volunteers took a lot of Legos with them. Lena met an architect at a library conference who donated so many Legos for the project that there were enough for both Exodo and the library In Kenya.



The library is dedicated to a college professor who worked



to improve the lives of the children at Exodo. Lena's husband painted her portrait.

The library has books to appeal to both reluctant and eager readers.



Project goals, preparation & training

One of the goals of the project was training volunteer library assistants. Lena is hoping to raise funds for tuition of the library trainees who are maintaining the library.

Lena described a "Readers' Theater" activity where children write scripts from a book which they all read. They then acted out the story of the book.





The Rotary donations totaled \$13,000. Lena's church donated another \$18,000. Lena and Donna are exploring a global grant to expand this project.

Lena is returning to Kenya in July to establish another school library in another slum neighborhood.

As a thank you for serving as co-leader on this grant program for our two Rotary clubs Stafford Rotary made Lena a Paul Harris Fellow.
