Program: Myriam Brown, Executive Director of Stafford Junction



Stafford Junction began in 2002. It is dedicated to improving lives through faith and action. The staff and volunteers are devoted to helping children and families in Stafford County who are struggling with poverty. Their mission is to provide meaningful support to those in need, focusing on education, empowerment, and healthy living. Stafford Junction works closely with residents, churches, service agencies, and businesses to build connections, foster understanding, and positively impact our community.

When the organization began it focused on the needs of the families in the Olde Forge neighborhood. Now Stafford Junction serves five neighborhoods in South Stafford and two neighborhoods in North Stafford. Our club worked closely

with Stafford Junction to aid immigrant families who lived in Olde Forge.

Myriam reviewed the programs that Stafford Junction offers.

BRAIN BUILDERS

This program provides after-school tutoring and mentoring to students, offering guided reading and math review as well as homework assistance. Additionally, students receive a nutritious meal or snack, and have access to Tide Me Over bags that contain shelf-stable groceries to prepare a meal for a family of four.

HEALTHY LIVING PAYS

A comprehensive program that offers workshops, clinics, and classes to educate individuals of all ages on how to live a healthy lifestyle. With a focus on nutrition, physical activity, healthcare assessments, and mental well-being, this program provides tools and resources to help individuals adopt healthy habits. The program also offers family memberships to the Massad Family YMCA, health fairs, screenings, field trips, and Tide Me Over Bags to support healthy living.

LIFE SKILLS

This program for adults provides a range of beneficial services, such as classes, coaching, and referrals, to improve educational, professional, and basic living skills. These services include ESL, GED, and financial seminars, as well as Tide Me Over Bags.

SUMMER JUNCTION

This program includes all the summer camps, activities, and field trips available through Stafford Junction and our partnership with Stafford County Sheriff's Office. From the SCSO Sports Camp, STEAM Camp, and Soccer Clinic at Olde Forge, to our five-week Camp Junction, there's something for ages K-12. Camp Junction focuses on making learning fun and reinforcing math and reading skills to combat summer learning loss. Participants also enjoy a healthy lunch and snacks and have access to Tide Me Over bags.

She also told us about the Holiday Giving Project that includes meals for family and gifts for 149 children. She also suggested ways we can help: Volunteering; Meals; Monetary Donations, School Supplies, and Holiday Giving.
