Susan Sigmon Justice Service Director Empowerhouse

Susan Sigmon is the Justice Services Director for Empowerhouse, a non-profit domestic violence agency located in Fredericksburg. She has worked in multiple service agencies, providing immediate and ongoing services to adults and children.

During her 12 years with Empowerhouse, she has

delivered direct services to over 2000 victims of domestic violence. She has been certified in court as an expert witness on intimate partner violence and has facilitated presentations and trainings about domestic violence, both locally and nationally, for law enforcement and other organizations.

She is a member of the Virginia Department of Criminal Justice Services Victims Crisis Assistance and Response Team, (DCJS VCART), and has provided direct response crisis intervention, grief counseling, and other services to primary and secondary victims of both the Virginia Beach and University of Virginia mass shootings. She is the Coordinator for the Lethality Assessment Protocol (LAP), which is in partnership with the Stafford County Sheriff's Office.

Susan is a 1987 graduate of Winthrop University. She has dedicated her professional career to providing trauma informed
