Maui Fires: DAUSA representative, who was at Maui, was able to see some of the devastation from the road, and the footprint of this fire is far-reaching. In August this year, the Rotary Club of Capitol Hill (RCCH) sent \$10,000 to the Rotary Club of Accra-South, Ghana, (incountry implementer) to start construction of the \$16,500 project. After an intensive biding process, a contractor was selected in September. Construction of the 6 water closet/4 urinals and two hand washing basin facility started on November 2nd. The facilities will be divided equally between men and women.

Below are the pictures I received on November 12th. According to the Rotary Club of Accra-South, the project is scheduled to be completed by the end of this year pending receipt of the outstanding \$6,500 to be sent by the RCCH. I will be in Ghana in December-January to see to the completion of the project and participate in the handing over of the downtown and uptown

facilities to the community. If you would like to join in the handing over ceremony, please let me know. I will share additional pictures as received.



Carroll Creek Rotary Goes Global

In a global community development initiative spanning three continents, launched by the Rotary Club of Carroll Creek, the first shipment of used bicycles has been loaded in Calgary, Alberta, Canada, bound for the port of Durban on South Africaâ€[™]s east coast. The Carroll Creek Rotary Club is teaming with the Rotary Club of Empangeni in the South African province of KwaZulu-Natal and the Rotary E-Club of the Karoo Region in the Northern Cape of South Africa to collect and ship over a three year period six forty-foot containers of used bicycles to South Africa, where Rotarians will distribute them for transportation to school, employment and healthcare throughout South Africa.

Local residents will be trained as bicycle mechanics, who will assemble, repair and maintain the bicycles. The shipping containers will remain on-site to serve as a bicycle storage and repair facilities. Local women will be enlisted as bicycle mechanics management skills in an effort to empower women.

2024 Rotary Peace Fellowship Results

In February 2023, applications opened for the 2024 Rotary Peace Fellowship. The fully funded Rotary Peace Fellowship, which covers tuition and living expenses, increases the capacity of existing leaders to prevent and resolve conflict by offering academic training, field experience, and professional networking. Rotary Peace Fellows are selected every year in a globally competitive process based on personal, academic, and professional achievements. Fellows earn either a masterâ€[™]s degree or a post-graduate diploma in peace and development studies at one of the Rotary Peace Centers located at leading universities around the world.

The Rotary Foundation has completed the review and selection process for the 2024 Rotary Peace Fellowship. According to Rotary Peace Centers, nearly 600 eligible applications were received, and 90 fellowship awards were made this year. Rotary Club of Rockville's recommended candidate - Awet Gebrekirstos Wereta was selected as an Alternate Candidate.
