

## Ukrainian Ambassador Addresses DC Club on January 31





## Parole Rotary's Books for International Goodwill



Books for International Goodwill (B.I.G.) was originally created by the Parole Rotary Club of Annapolis to send books to underserved populations. Contact is made to local Rotary chapters, for distribution to those who would appreciate the donated books. A team of Rotarians, and community volunteers, process books donated to B.I.G and prepare them for shipping. BIG has donated books to over 40 countries. In 2023, B.I.G processed over 250,000 books and shipped approximately 120,000. Recent shipments have gone to Albania, Tanzania, Nigeria Kyrgyzstan and Mongolia and books are being readied for shipment in 2024. The most positive feedback comes from the fact that recipients ask for additional shipments. For many it's their first book! The Parole Rotary just recently shipped its 9.5 millionth book !! To cover the cost of the shipping, as well as operating expenses, books are made available to the public and booksellers, through a weekend book sale - held one weekend a month. Over \$150,000 was raised in 2023.


## 2024 Pre-PETS Training - January 20, 2024

## In Memoriam: Charlie Harris, Smoketown Rotary Club



Charles Edmund “Charlie” Harris passed from this life January 29, 2024 with his beloved wife, Sherry, by his side. He was 73 years old.

Born February 13, 1950, in Danville, Virginia, Charlie was the son of Garfield Harris, a farmer, and Eva Rakes Harris, a mill worker. Gifted in mathematics from a young age, he was the first member of his family to go to college and he earned all three degrees from Virginia Tech – a bachelor’s degree in aerospace engineering, a master’s degree in engineering mechanics and a PhD in engineering science and mechanics. In 2011 he was inducted into the Virginia Tech Academy of Engineering Excellence, which is the highest honor that can be bestowed.

Charlie taught at Texas A&M University but was recruited by NASA Langley Research Center in Hampton, Virginia, where he spent the rest of his career, ultimately leading research operations for the entire center. Notably, NASA granted Charlie an Exceptional Engineering Achievement Medal for his role in the Space Shuttle Return to Flight initiative, which uncovered the root cause of the 2000 Columbia Space Shuttle explosion – work that enabled the resumption of the Space Shuttle program. In 2007 President George W. Bush conferred on him the rank of distinguished executive in the Senior Executive Service for sustained and extraordinary accomplishment.

For many years, Cliff served on the BWN Scholarship Committee, actively helping to raise funds for scholarships. This ranged from bringing the 50/50 can to BWN Happy Hours in years past, handling logistics at various events, to emceeding the online bingo fundraiser during the pandemic. Cliff rarely missed a scholarship committee meeting and took very seriously the selection of scholarship recipients.
